What is it?

Sport Fishing, Wildlife and Entomology members, parents and leaders and those interested in learning more, should make plans now to attend the Wild Bug Fish Camp. There will be several up close, hands on educational programs on wildlife, wildlife habitat, fishing, tackle crafting, aquatic environment, entomology, etc. The camp will provide plenty of fishing, fly tying, wildlife viewing, insect catching and learning with a little camping and a lot of fun thrown in. Don't miss this chance to fish, view and learn about wildlife, add to your insect collection and have fun with other 4-H members. Interested members and leaders do not have to be enrolled in the projects to attend.



What's in it for you?

The Wild Bug Fish Camp is designed to allow leaders, junior leaders and younger members to participate together in a learning experience focusing on the natural resources and the environment.

Experienced personnel will be present to provide hands on interactive learning experience second to none.

Sport Fishing members will have time allotted for learning fly tying, tackle crafting, aquatic ecology, and an abundant amount of fishing in high elevation streams and lakes. Those interested in wildlife will likely see many of the species native to the Colorado Rockies including Rocky Mt. Bighorn



Sheep, Elk, Deer, Mt. Goats, Porcupine, many species of birds and small mammals. Young entomologists will have a unique opportunity to capture, classify and preserve a variety of insects native only to higher elevations.



The outstanding educational experiences provided by the Wild Bug Fish camp are second to none for youth interested in natural resources such as wildlife, sport fishing and entomology. While the camp focuses on youth development through the 4-H project highlighted there is plenty of time for fun, friends and food. Campers experience the outdoors through the rustic camping experience, gain a strong appreciation for the environment we live in and are exposed to the history of Colorado through visits to the sites of historical events.
